Coyote Point Museum is recruiting for a seasonal Environmental Day Camp Leader for **Camp Coyote**, Coyote Point Museum's Summer Day Camp. Environmental Day Camp Leaders work as educators, mentors, and positive role models for campers age 3-12 yrs. old. Day Camp Leaders implement an engaging camp program our educational philosophy and principles of phenomena based education! Camp sessions may include art, stewardship projects, field trips, campouts, live animal encounters, outdoor exploration and more!

The Environmental Day Camp Leaders may work with any of the five age appropriate camp programs along with Museum staff and volunteer youth (Leaders in Training). Camps run daily from 8:30am – 5:00pm. This position starts on or before June 2, 2008. Camp personnel training is provided from June 2 - 13, 2008. Camps begin on June 16th and continues through August 22nd.

Examples of Job Duties:

- Lead day camp programs for a camp of 10-24 youth and/or a small group of 8-10 children in camp activities
- Prepare, set-up and clean up camp materials and equipment
- Assist in the creative development of appropriate camp activities and programs
- Mentor Leader in Training youth volunteers
- Insure safety and well-being of campers
- Lead camp groups on off-site field trips, Museum overnights, and/or off-site campouts

Minimum Qualifications:

- Two years of college with a major (or clear emphasis) in a physical or natural science, environmental education or a related field. Experience may be substituted for education.
- Two years experience working with children in an educational or camp setting.
- Bilingual ability in English/Spanish and multi-cultural familiarity are highly desirable.

Special Requirements:

- Possession of valid Class "C" California Driver's License or ability to obtain one before hire, and satisfactory driving history.
- Current First Aid/CPR certification (child and adult) or willingness to obtain certification at the Museum's expense.
- Department of Justice fingerprinting clearance at Museum expense.
